
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
















South Carolina Tuition Grants

2022-2023 Maximum Grant

- Maximum Grants for 2022-2023 are set at \$4,500 at all eligible colleges
- This is the largest Maximum Grant in the Program's 52-year history
- The Commission estimates it will award over \$52 million in 2022-2023 to nearly 12,000 students



How to Apply

- ➤ Complete the FAFSA online at <u>fafsa.gov</u> (<u>studentaid.gov</u>)
- Student and at least one parent must have an assigned FSAID (authentication tool used as electronic signature) Must use their own individual email addresses to sign up at studentaid.gov
- ➤ Available annually on October 1
 - ➤ Using Prior-Prior Year Data: 2021 tax year data for the 2023-2024 FAFSA
- ➤ The FAFSA must be <u>received</u> by the federal processor by JUNE 30!
- ➤ New FAFSA required by deadline every year







- ➤ Based on Financial Need as calculated using FAFSA data
 - ➤ Must meet all Federal aid eligibility requirements
- ➤ Must be South Carolina residents (Parents of "dependent" students must be permanent South Carolina residents)
 - ➤ Be sure to answer ALL residency questions
- ➤ Grant Awarded for Fall/Spring
 - Must attend full-time and must attend Fall term; Not attending Fall term forfeits the Tuition Grant for the full year
 - ➤ *Not available for Summer terms*
- ➤ Tuition Grants limited to a total of 4 years (8 semesters)
- ➤ Eligibility restricted to first four-year degree



Academic Requirements

- ➤ Incoming Freshman must:
 - ► Rank in top 75% of graduating class <u>OR</u>
 - Score 900 on SAT (Math and Evidence-based Reading and Writing Sections only) <u>OR</u>
 - Score 19 on ACT OR
 - Graduate from a SC high school with a final GPA of 2.7 on the SC Uniform Grading Policy
- ➤Once enrolled, continuing students must continue to meet the college's Federal Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements



Eligibility Notices


- ➤ Tentative Eligibility Notifications begin in late Spring
- > Notices are sent to the email listed on the FAFSA
 - ➤ Be sure students use a personal, active email address not a school-specific or district email address
- ➤ Tentative Awards are made to the first eligible private college listed on the FAFSA
- ➤ Can be transferred if the student decides to attend another eligible private college

- ➤ Goal is to reduce the number of questions on the FAFSA from 108 to about 36
- ➤ More data to be transferred directly from the IRS, reducing likelihood of errors and verification
- ➤ Removal of the Selective Service and drug conviction eligibility criteria for Federal Aid Programs
 - ➤ Questions slated to be removed for the 2023-2024 FAFSA (opening 10/1/22)
 - ➤ In 2021-22, Student's answers to these questions did not impact eligibility for Federal Aid (like Pell Grant, SEOG, Federal Student Loans, and Work Study Programs) Colleges instructed to ignore these questions when packaging Federal Aid



FAFSA Simplification Updates

➤ Large majority of changes to the FAFSA will not go into effect until the 2024-25 Academic Year (FAFSA opening 10/1/23) — STAY TUNED!

>FUTURE CHANGES:

- > Expected Family Contribution (EFC) will be replaced with a Student Aid Index (SAI)
- ➤ Elimination of Asset Reporting for certain students; Redefined/Simplified Asset Reporting for others
- ➤ New calculations to determine Pell Grant eligibility, with more students qualifying for the Maximum Pell Grant
- Change in determining which parent(s) must include FAFSA information in the case of divorce or separation
