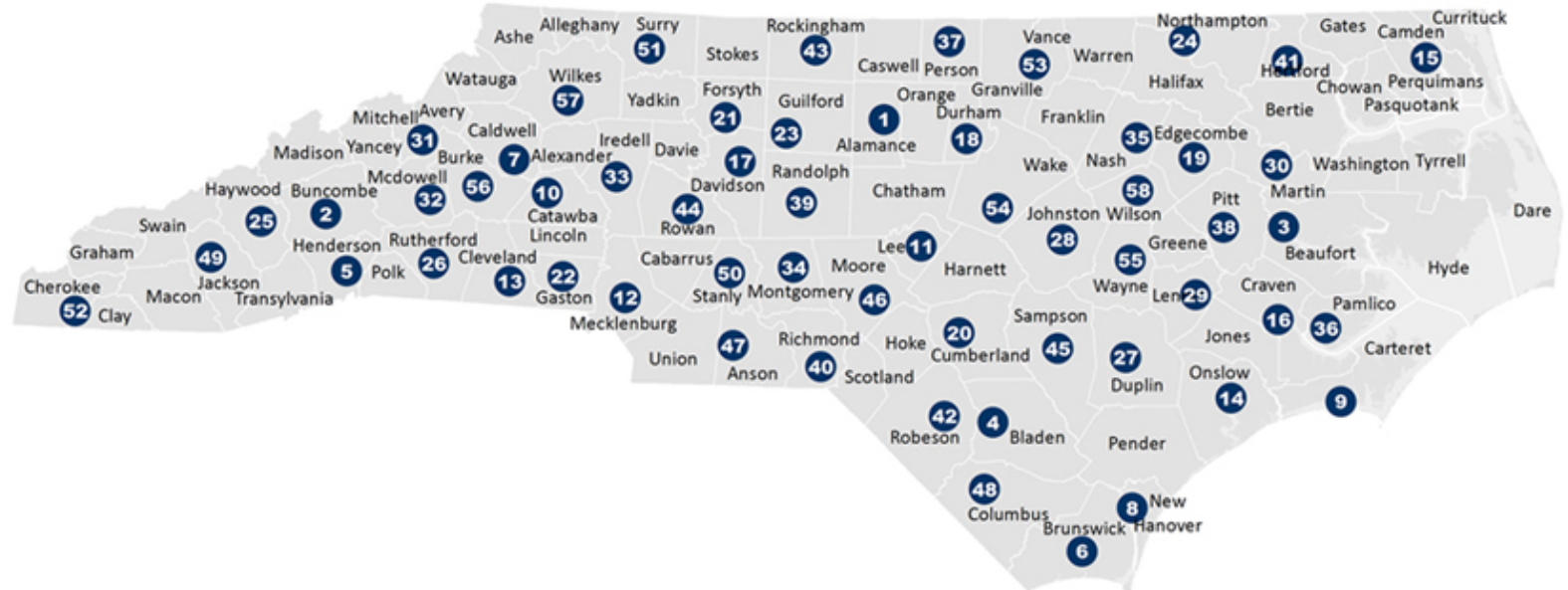

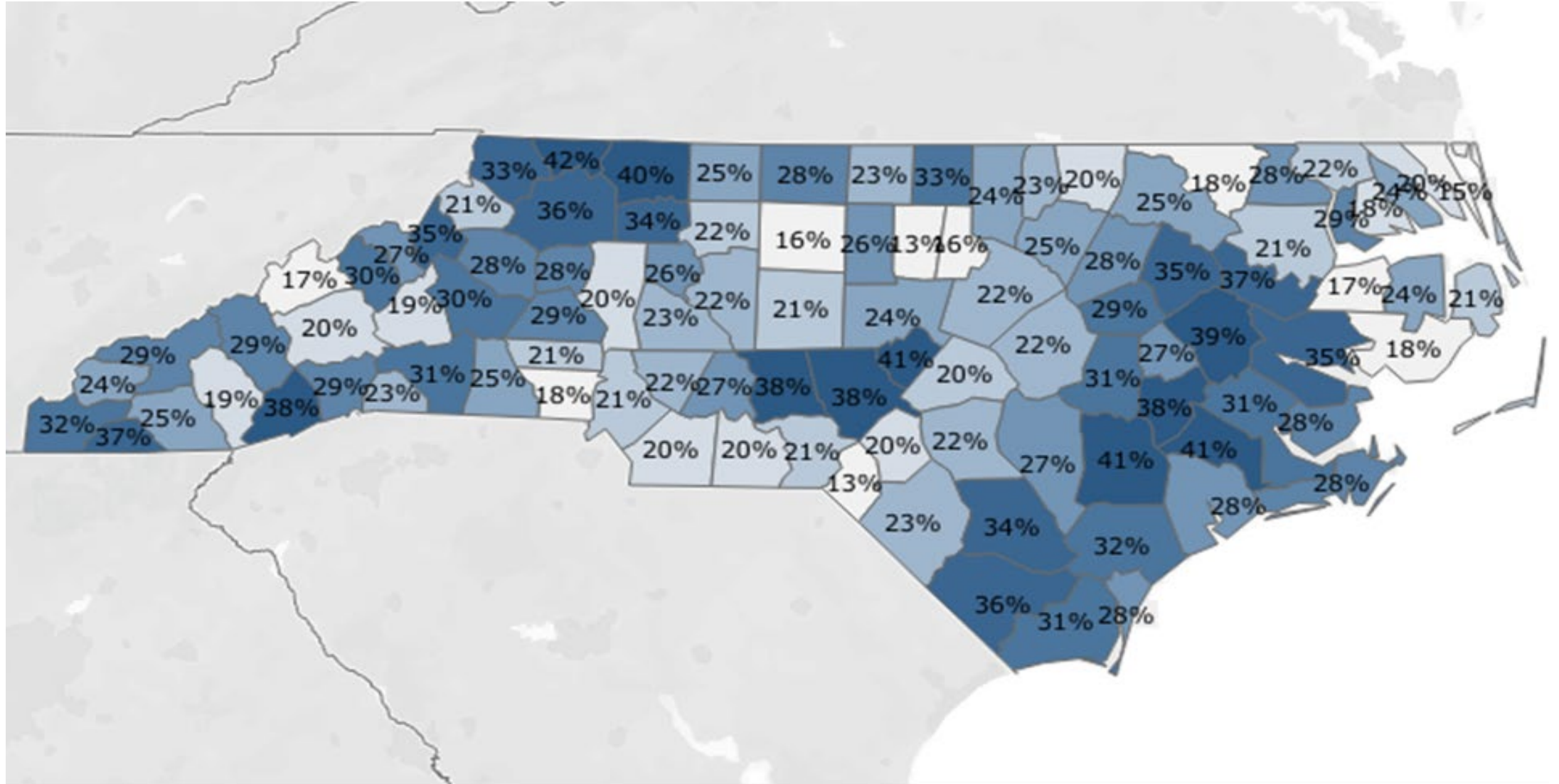

Special Circumstances:

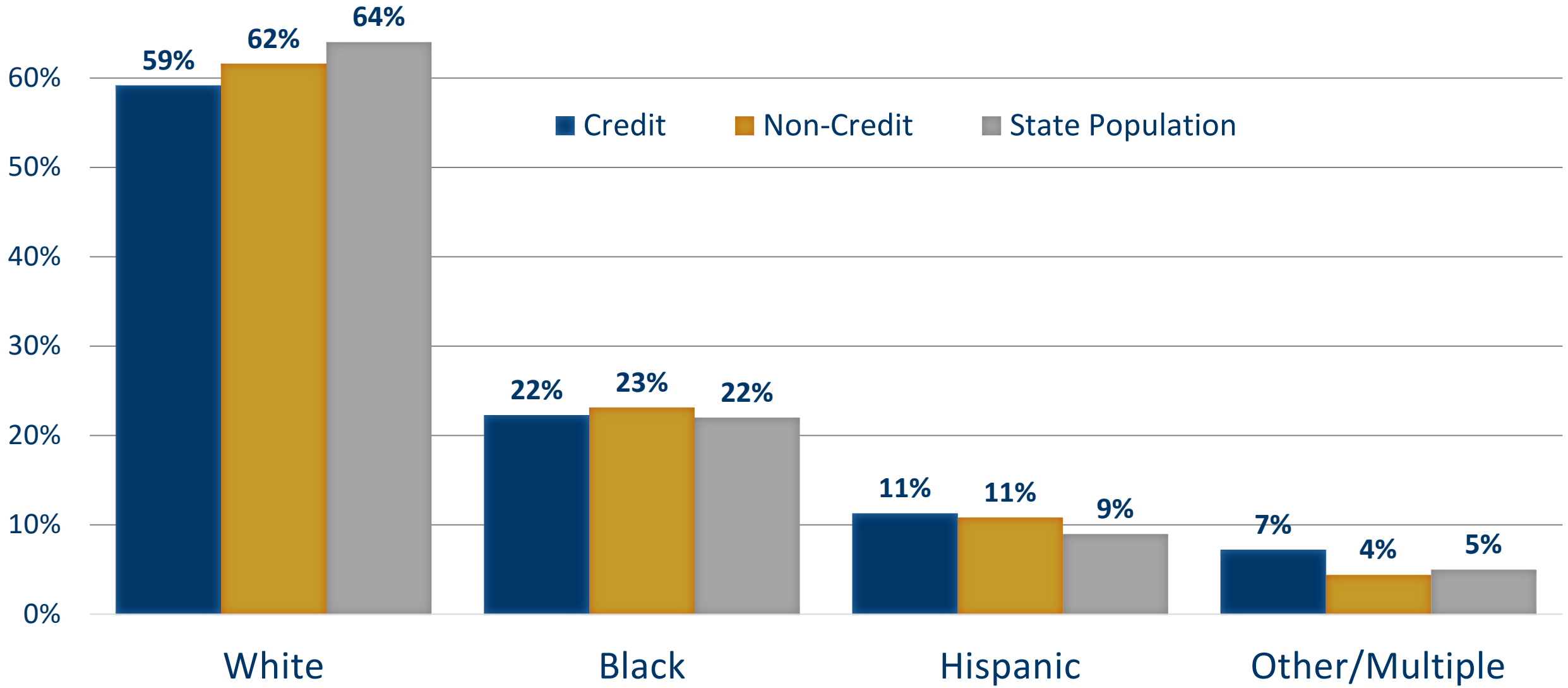
- Active military duty transfer to NC

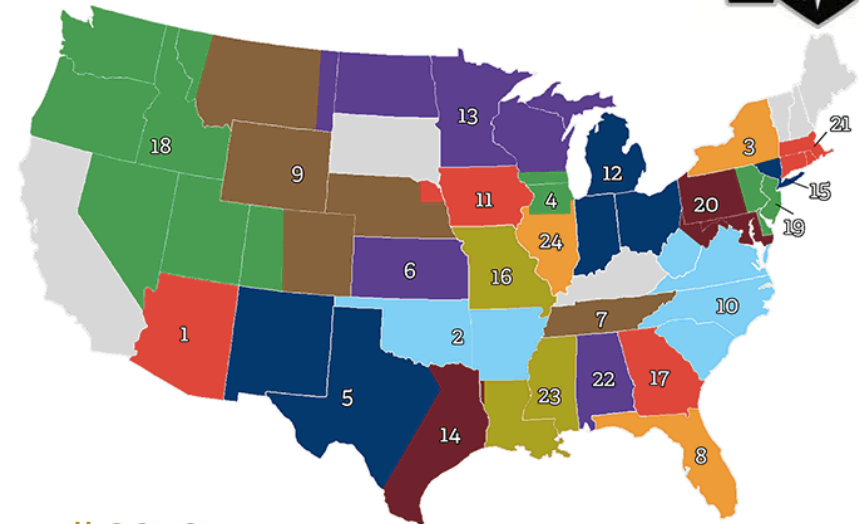
Students who **complete** a degree **before** transferring have **higher** GPAs and graduation rates at their four-year institutions than students who transfer early.

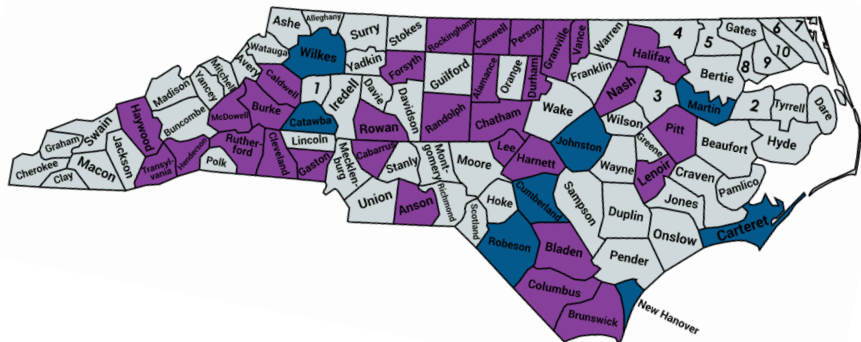

NC Career Coach Program

The purpose of the NC Career Coach Program is to place community college career coaches in high schools to assist students with determining career goals and identifying community college programs that would enable students to achieve these goals.

Provide career development activities

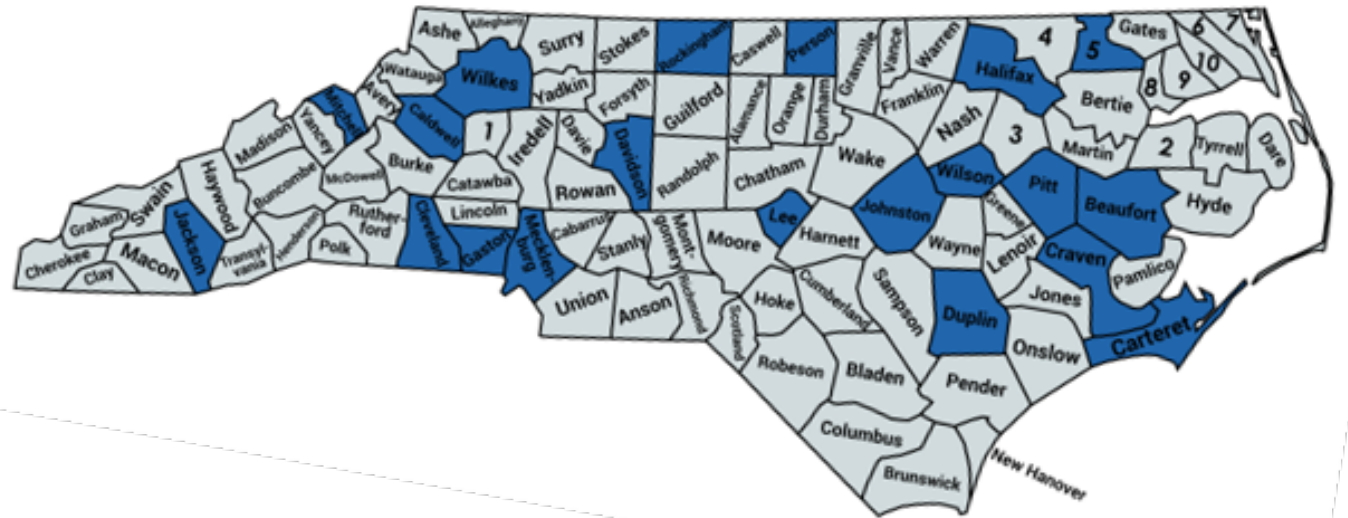

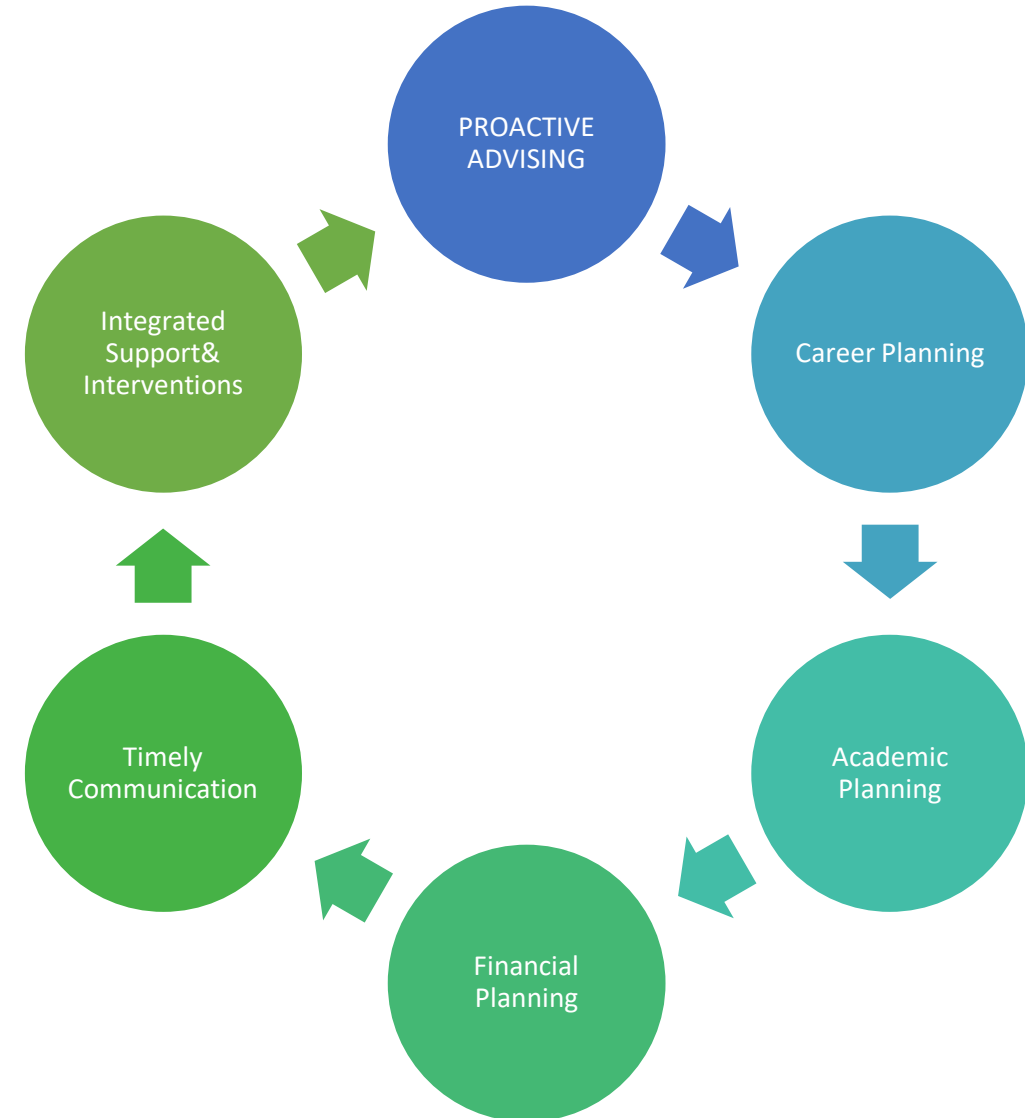

TRIO programs in North Carolina

Multiple Measures

A recent high school graduate who has an unweighted 2.6 GPA and has successfully completed 4 eligible math courses, will be exempt from diagnostic placement testing and will be considered “college ready”.



If a recent high school graduate does not meet the GPA benchmark, the college will use the specified ACT or SAT subject area test scores.



If a recent high school graduate does not meet the GPA or ACT or SAT thresholds, the college will administer a diagnostic placement test.

Reinforced Instruction for Student Excellence (RISE)

- RISE Goals

- Place students into gateway level courses with mandated corequisite supports.
- Eliminate the placement test (except in rare cases),
- Raising the GPA criteria from 2.6 to 2.8.

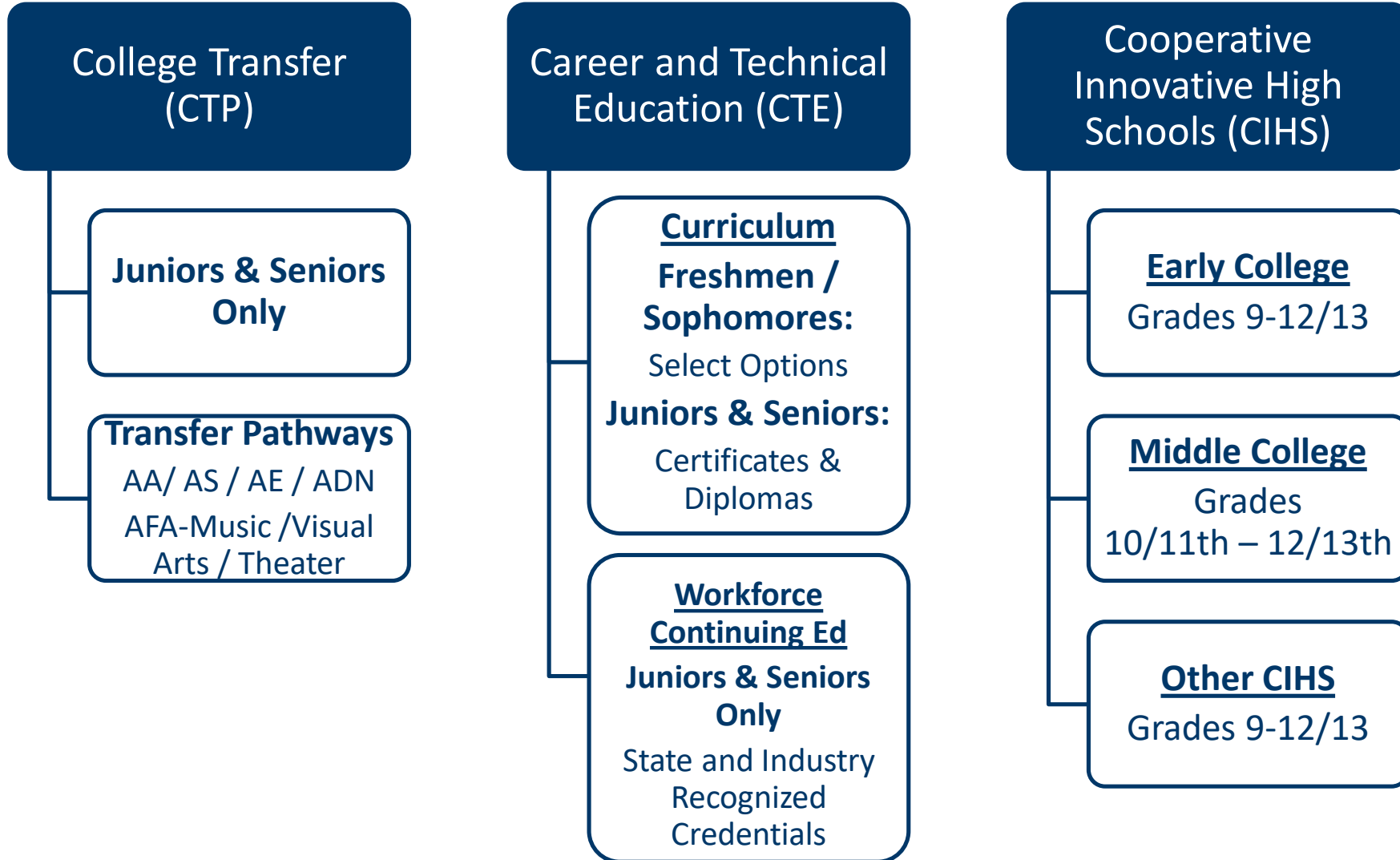

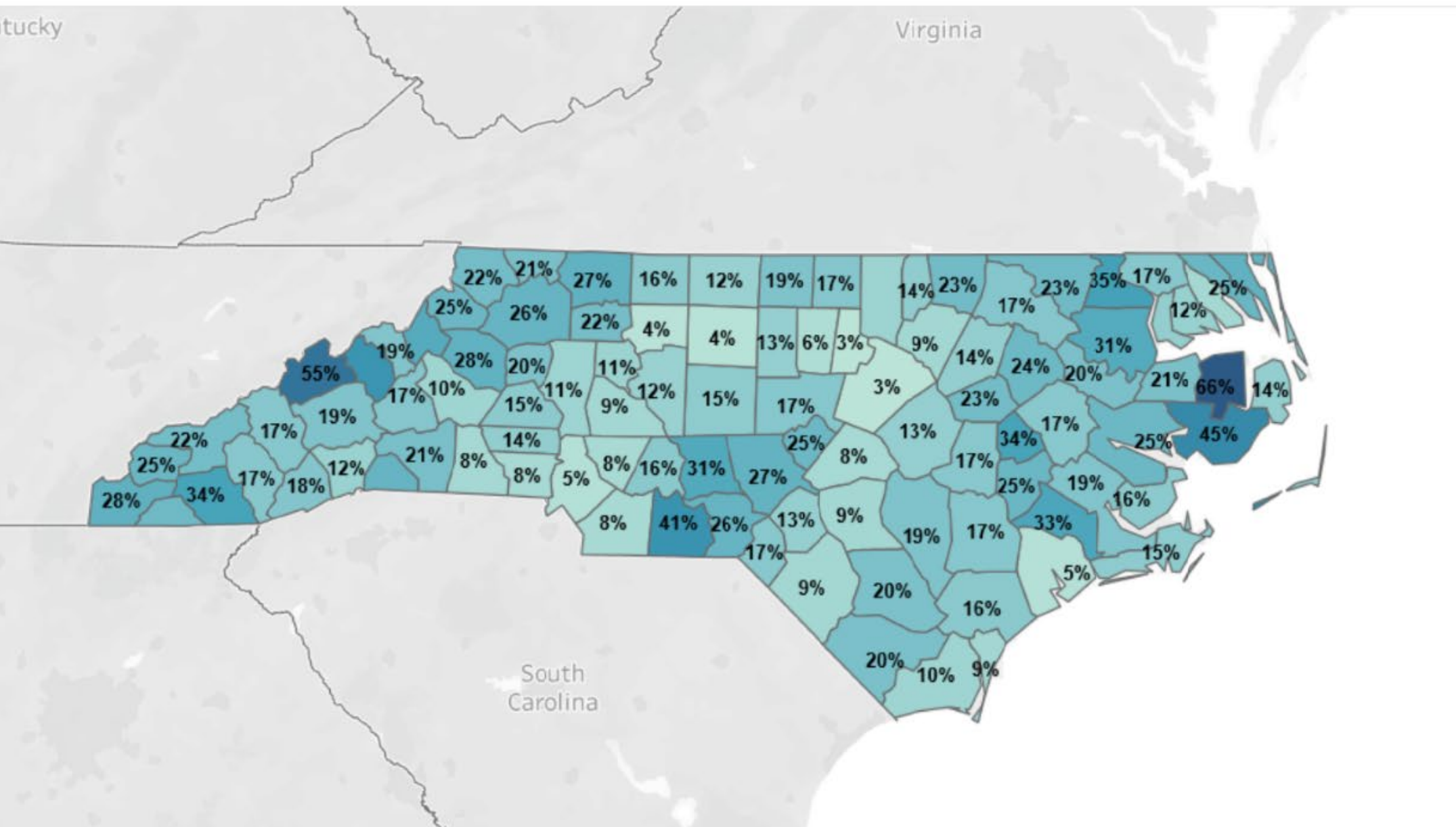
Career and College Promise

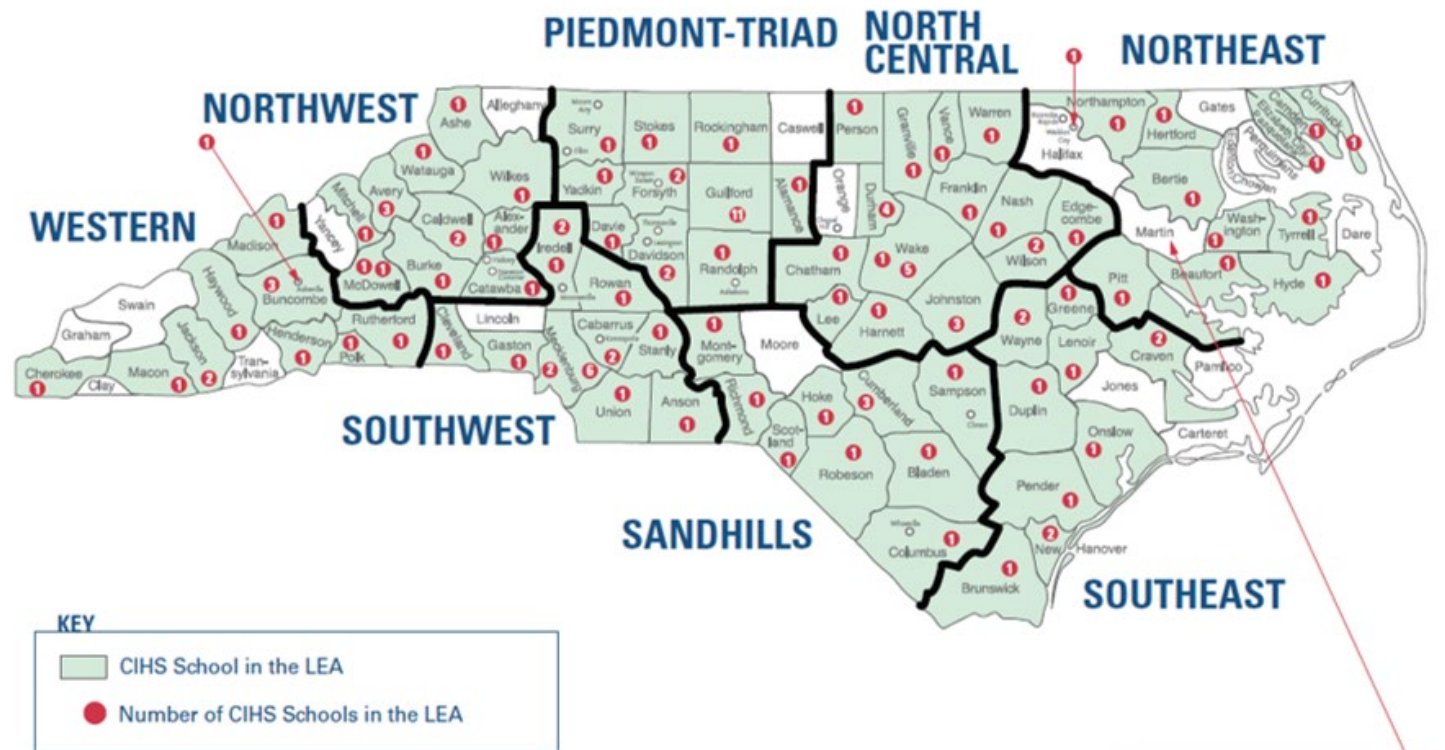
