At this time, students applying to community colleges must complete the residency determination **prior** to the submission of the application.

Tuition rates:

\$76.00 Per credit hour in-state

\$268.00 Per credit hour out-of-state


Special Circumstances:

- Active military duty transfer to NC

- Employer / non-profit sponsorship.




Subsequent Enrollment of High School Graduates



NC Career Coach Program

The purpose of the NC Career Coach Program is to place community college career coaches in high schools to assist students with determining career goals and identifying community college programs that would enable students to achieve these goals.

Individual and group career planning





 Advising takes place across all 58 community colleges as well as the Continuing Education, College and Career Readiness and Curriculum areas.

One College, One Door



Multiple Measures

A recent high school graduate who has an unweighted 2.6 GPA and has successfully completed 4 eligible math courses, will be exempt from diagnostic placement testing and while be considered "college ready".



If a recent high school graduate does not meet the GPA benchmark, the college will use the specified ACT or SAT subject area test scores.



If a recent high school graduate does not meet the GPA or ACT or SAT thresholds, the college will administer a diagnostic placement test.

English	Math
ACT Reading 22 OR ACT English 18	ACT Math 22
SAT Writing 500 OR SAT Critical Reading 500 (If taken prior to Mar. 2016)	SAT Math 500
SAT 480 Reading (If taken after March 2016)	SAT Math 530 (If taken after March 2016)



Reinforced Instruction for Student Excellence (RISE)

- RISE Goals
 - Place students into gateway level courses with mandated corequisite supports.
 - Eliminate the placement test (except in rare cases),
 - Raising the GPA criteria from 2.6 to 2.8.
- RISE Placement
 - GPA is first placement Measure
 - With 10 years
 - US High School
 - No 4th Math Required.




