^{**-} Criteria must be met by the time of enrollment at the UNC institution

^{***-} Being exempt from these requirements does not guarantee admission. While applicants are not required to meet these GPA, test score and course requirements, institutions will only admit applicants who meet all campus-specific admission requirements.



Minimum Course Requirements

Six course units in language, including:

- four units in English emphasizing grammar, composition, and literature, and
- two units of a language other than English.

Four course units of mathematics, in any of the following combinations:

- common core I, II, III
- algebra I and II, geometry, and one unit beyond algebra II,
- algebra I and II, and two units beyond algebra II, or
- integrated math I, II, and III, and one unit beyond integrated math III.

(The fourth unit of math affects applicants to all institutions except the North Carolina School of the Arts.) It is recommended that prospective students take a mathematics course unit in the twelfth grade.

Three course units in science, including:

- at least one unit in a life or biological science (for example, biology),
- · at least one unit in physical science (for example, physical science, chemistry, physics), and
- at least one laboratory course.

Two course units in social studies, including one unit in U.S. history, but an applicant who does not have the unit in U.S. history may be admitted on the condition that at least three semester hours in that subject will be passed by the end of the sophomore year.

AP Credit Policy-700.10.1

- UNC System institutions shall award appropriate credit to undergraduates who have earned a score of three or higher on one or more AP exams

Focusing on Affordability

Fixed Tuition Benefit

- Student's tuition remains fixed based on:
 - Program length (8 or 10 semesters)
 - Student classification
 - Must be continuously enrolled
 - Transfer students receive fixed tuition for a prorated time





NC Promise

NC Promise Tuition Plan

- ALL new, returning, and transfer students will pay reduced tuition
- Reduce in-state tuition cost to \$500 per semester and out-of-state tuition to \$2,500 per semester
- No eligibility requirements
- Room and board costs will not be impacted

IN-STATE TUITION THAT'S JUST \$500 PER SEMESTER AT THREE UNIVERSITIES

This plan sets undergraduate in-state tuition at just \$500 per semester and out-of-state tuition at just \$2,500 per semester at three UNC System universities. North Carolinians can earn a high-quality education at an affordable cost at Elizabeth City State University, UNC Pembroke, and Western Carolina University.

The plan increases educational access, reduces student debt, and grows the state's economy. These three campuses are geographically diverse and located across the state, ensuring every North Carolinian lives within 150 miles of an NC Promise university.

All students, including those who began their college career before Fall 2018, are eligible. Student fees, including the costs of room and board, are not included.
